

DAY 1: Arrive Buenos Aires, Argentina

Arrive in Argentina's capital and transfer to your hotel, where you spend the rest of the day at leisure.

DAY 2: Buenos Aires | Vibrant Latin American City

Latin passion and European romance define the beautiful city of Buenos Aires, a dynamic mecca known for its wide-ranging architectural styles, contemporary and historic arts, and culinary pleasures and *parrillas* (steakhouses). DAY 3: Ushuaia | Gateway to Antarctica

Fly to the charming port town of Ushuaia, the southernmost city in the world. On arrival, enjoy a gourmet lunch at the Arakur resort, enjoying panoramic city and mountain vistas while you dine. Time and weather permitting, take a guided walk in the Cerro Alarken Nature Reserve or simply relax with a cappuccino and enjoy scenic views of Ushuaia. This afternoon, transfer to your ship and settle in for your first night on board. Wander the decks to become acquainted with the ship, relax in the lounge and mingle with fellow guests in anticipation of your voyage. From your private balcony or the outside decks, take in views as you cruise the beautiful Beagle Channel before heading out to sea. 'Le Lyréal' | Meals: B L D

DAYS 4-5: The Drake Passage | Legendary Waters

The journey south toward Antarctica is an exciting one, furthered by singular, voyage-long access to our

knowledgeable Expedition Team and enrichment experts — both on board and on shore. Set out into the Drake Passage, a 600-mile-wide swath of water where the Southern Ocean currents are squeezed between South America's southern tip and Antarctica's northernmost reaches. An important trade route in the 19th and early 20th centuries, the waters and icy conditions that define this passage once made the journey a difficult one, though the stabilizer-equipped 'Le Lyrial' handles it with ease. After lunch, enjoy a stimulating presentation from one of your expert lecturers or join your naturalists on the deck to look for whales and abundant seabirds, which join other mammals in feasting on the Drake's krill-rich waters. 

Liefdefjorden (Loves Bay) in far northern Svalbard, another excellent area for spotting polar bears and wildlife; and

Sjuøyane (“Seven Islands”), the most northerly region of the Svalbard archipelago.

Discover the Ilulissat Icefjord, a UNESCO World Heritage Site at the mouth of one of the fastest and most active glaciers in the world, Sermeq Kujalleq. Amid its spectacular giant icebergs, floating growlers and bergy bits, listen for the sounds of the calving ice-stream. Take a walking tour of Ilulissat, visit its local history museum, and meet with villagers to learn about life in this harsh Arctic region. Ummannaq Fjords: Located north of Ilulissat, this system boasts a geological wonder teeming with marine life. Visit Karrat to enjoy views of the iceberg-studded bay and discover the remains of ancient huts, built by Thule hunters (ancestors of the Inuit) more than 500 years ago.

Kullorsuaq: Translated as "Big Thumb" in the native Kalaallisut in homage of Devil's Thumb, a nearby prominent mountain, Kullorsuaq remains one of the most traditional hunting, fishing and trading villages in Greenland.



The Northwest Passage: Incomparable Legacy of Exploration

To sail the sea route linking the Atlantic and Pacific oceans is a goal that has fired the imaginations of seafaring explorers and traders for centuries. Like the search for the source of the Nile or the city of Troy, the quest to conquer the once-indomitable Northwest Passage is the stuff of legend.

Lure of the Arctic Grail

Courage, skill, perseverance and no small amount of luck were once the prerequisites for anyone attempting to conquer the Northwest Passage, some 500 miles north of the Arctic Circle. It wasn't until the early 20th century that the daunting feat was finally accomplished.

Since then, no more than a few thousand hearty souls have transited the entire route. And while it remains an exclusive club, it's one A&K invites you to join in 2020.

"The Northwest Passage is unique, a voyage that can be done only with a specific vessel during a very short period of the year," notes A&K's Captain Etienne Garcia. "It's a historical voyage in the wake of great explorers like Roald Amundsen and Robert McClure. Altogether, this makes for a very special cruise."

Over the last four centuries, countless explorers sought to traverse the passage, vying with the shifting ice for the sake of king and commerce, but never achieving success. Many turned back due to ferocious weather or intractable ice, while a few likely regretted not having done so, including Captain Sir John Franklin, whose lost expedition remains one of the most mysterious of the age of exploration.

The journey was at last successfully completed by McClure, an Irishman in command of the British ship 'Investigator,' who crossed from west to east between 1850 to 1854.

McClure, however, travelled by both boat and sledge, and it was not until Norwegian polar explorer Amundsen finished a three-year expedition in 1906, that someone finally traversed the length of the passage entirely under sail. It would take until 1969 for the first commercial vessel to successfully navigate the passage.

A Fascinating Landscape

A&K Expedition Team member Ralph Eshelman shares a passion for this passage and its place in the greater scheme of east-west exploration. "As a maritime historian and geologist, this part of the world fascinates me," says Ralph. "Most folks don't realize that the Northwest Passage is actually a series of several different passages, not just one. Ice conditions often influence exactly what the passage may be.

"Some of the oldest rocks on earth are found here. Amazingly, despite the cold, there are fossils of dinosaurs and trees that tell a story of a once-warmer climate. In the absence of vegetation today, these rocks are clearly visible. And when snow and ice recede, a glimpse of a geological wonderland that few travellers ever witness is revealed."

SEP1-8: Nunavut & the Canadian Arctic Archipelago | Heart of the Northwest Passage

Cruise into the Canadian Arctic Archipelago of Nunavut, where you begin your journey to the heart of the Northwest Passage. As 'Le Boreal' winds through legendary channels and inlets, A&K's enrichment specialists continue to spark captivating discussions that enhance your discovery. Your crew and Expedition Team determine your itinerary, which is dependent on weather, sea, ice and wildlife conditions. Exciting excursions may include:

Pond Inlet: At the Northern end of Baffin Island, Pond Inlet ("Place of Mittima's Grave") is the gateway to the Northwest Passage and a rich archaeological site. After clearing customs formalities for Nunavut, embark on a shore excursion to an area once inhabited by the ancient Thule. Visit the Nattinnak Visitor's Center or Toonoonik Sagoonik Co-op, where you can shop for soapstone artisan carvings, beautiful wall hangings and other handcrafted goods.

Lancaster Sound: Situated between Devon Island and Baffin Island, this body of water forms the eastern entrance to the Parry Channel and the Northwest Passage. It's also home to a rich abundance of Arctic cod, which draw a seasonal population of sea birds and marine mammals. Beluga and endangered bowhead whales, and ringed and bearded seals, as well as northern fulmars, black guillemots and Arctic terns are among some of the wildlife that inhabits the area.

Beechey Island: Historic moments in Arctic exploration define this island, best known for providing a safe haven to British explorer Sir John Franklin in 1845. Look east toward Resolute Bay at the huge silhouette of Cape Riley and imagine what Captain Franklin saw here in Erebus Harbour,

where he took shelter for two years before his ill-fated attempt to conquer the Northwest Passage. See the wooden grave markers for three of Franklin's men, now bleached by the sun, and visit the cenotaph memorial erected in memory of the lost explorer. It is an unforgettable experience.

Fort Ross: An abandoned trading post on the tip of Somerset Island, Fort Ross was founded in 1937 as a place for trappers to barter Arctic fox pelts in exchange for food and necessities. Explore the remaining wooden buildings of the post, which closed in 1948, and imagine life in such a barren landscape. Perhaps take a Zodiac excursion to CoBay, keeping watch for local wildlife and learning about residents from expert, accompanying naturalists.

Gjoa Haven: During his first attempt to transit the Northwest Passage on 'Gjoa,' Roald Amundsen used this natural harbor as a respite while waiting for ice conditions to improve. For two years, he lived with the Netsilik Inuits, learning their skills for survival and more efficient travel, which would later prove invaluable in his successful South Pole expedition.





Spy the luxuriously tufted musk oxen in the Yukon Territory

Victoria Island: Cruise along the south coast of Victoria Island, which straddles both Nunavut and the Northwest Territories, voyaging through Queen Maud Gulf, Dease Strait and Coronation Gulf. Expedition stops may include bird sanctuary Jenny Lind Island and Johansen Bay, home to the remains of a nomadic trapper base camp. Your Expedition Team may also lead you to Ulukhaktok (Holman village) in Queen’s Bay for an unforgettable visit with its local Inuit people. Only in contact with the rest of the world since the middle of the 19th century, the people of Holman still practice a traditional lifestyle. Experience a warm welcome with drum dances, taste fresh char and bannock rings (fried dough) prepared over an open fire, and tour the town art center. There, discover Ulukhaktok’s beautiful printmaking tradition as well as carvings, hats made of coveted *qiviut* (musk ox wool), and traditional *ulus*, half-moon-shaped knives used by women to prepare food and skins. ‘Le Boreal’ | Meals: B L D

SEP 9: Franklin Bay & the “Smoking Hills” |
Endless Fire

In the Northwest Territories at Franklin Bay, tread where few will and see the spectacular and enormous “Smoking Hills,” cliffs of bituminous shale that endlessly combust and burn. This rare geological phenomenon has likely been occurring for millennia, with layers of the relatively unstable mineral jarosite covering these hills. When the mineral comes into contact with cold air, it becomes red-hot and produces a thick, black smoke — a fantastic sight similar to the smoky fumaroles produced by volcanoes, though far rarer to see. ‘Le Boreal’ | Meals: B L D

SEP10-12: Herschel Island & the Yukon Territory |
Safe Haven in the Farthest Reaches

During a long mapping expedition in 1826, Captain Franklin was the first European to lay eyes on this unique island at the northernmost point of the Yukon Territory. Named by Franklin, Herschel Island is a bear-populated landmark in the West Arctic and has since served alternately as a whaling station, relay station and refuge for travellers. The island supports numerous species of wildlife, which seasonally may include musk ox and arctic fox. It is also one of the only places on earth where you may see a grizzly bear, black bear and polar bear, the last of which live along the ice edge in summer. Evidence of the island’s whaling culture and Thule predecessors remains along its coastline — one that is also greatly affected by the impacts of sea erosion and climate change. ‘Le Boreal’ | Meals: B L D



SEP13-14: Beaufort & Chukchi Seas |
Waters of the White One

Typically dense with ice floes and fog, the Beaufort Sea opens up a 60-mile-wide coastal pass from August to September. From here, ‘Le Boreal’ cruises into the U.S. and clears at Point Barrow, Alaska (U.S. Customs

clearance only). Sailing in the comfort of your luxury cruiser, continue participating in exciting talks led by your Expedition Team. Still hunted on a sustenance quota basis by local Inuit, beluga whales travel in numbers here and are said to be quite “chatty,” with their clicks and squeals audible above the surface. In the late evening, relax on your private balcony or join fellow guests on deck and, with some luck, witness the northern lights, known for delivering a stunning display in autumn. ‘Le Boreal’ | Meals: B L D

SEP15: Little Diomedé | Along the Alaskan Coast
Continue cruising through the Bering Sea to Little Diomedé, an island between Alaska and Russia at the edge of the International Dateline. Enjoy a Zodiac cruise of the island, where the Ingalikmiut maintain a traditional lifestyle of hunting, fishing and egg gathering. In line with customs and necessity, the Ingalikmiut also use seal, walrus and polar bear hides for trade currency as well as to make clothing, parkas and hats. ‘Le Boreal’ | Meals: B L D

SEP16: Nome, Alaska | Gold Rush Fever
Arrive and disembark in Nome, Alaska, among the wildest reaches of mainland America and the final destination for the Iditarod dogsled competition. Gold can still be mined here, and you may try gold panning firsthand; also experience a dogsled demonstration and a stop at the Bering Sea Land Bridge National Monument visitor’s center. After lunch at Old St. Joe’s Church, enjoy time at leisure in downtown Nome. Transfer to the airport for your chartered internal flight to Anchorage, and then either continue on with your homebound flight, or join the Alaska post-tour extension. Meals: B L







Lacepede Islands: Set atop a coral reef, these four low-lying cay islands are separated from mainland Australia by the Lacepede Channel. The "Lacepedes," as they are often called, are an important nesting site for green sea turtles and several species of seabirds, including brown boobies, red-chested frigate birds, crested terns and speckled ruddy turnstones.



Horizontal Falls: An exciting visit awaits at Horizontal Falls, described by David Attenborough as “one of the greatest natural wonders of the world.” Set within Talbot Bay, the horizontally flowing waterfalls are created when massive tidal currents squeeze through two narrow gorges. Due to the nature of Luxury Expedition Cruises, itineraries are for guidance purposes only and may be adjusted due to unforeseen circumstances including weather, wildlife, ice, medical emergencies and other conditions beyond A&K's control at the sole discretion of the Captain on board.

AIR TRANSPORTATION

International airfare (to the journey starting point and from the ending point) is not included in program pricing. A&K has special agreements with many air carriers and can offer quotations from any gateway. Some journeys require internal flights as specified in the itinerary. This airfare is typically not included and must be purchased from A&K in addition to the journey. In the instance where charter flights are used and seating is limited, A&K reserves the right to substitute and confirm air reservations on a suitable alternative scheduled air flight. All internal air is based on economy class seating and is 100% non-refundable at time of final payment (some exceptions may apply). All international and internal air quotes are subject to change until final payment has been received by A&K. Flight confirmation is based on availability. Air reservations cannot be confirmed until a passport copy is received by A&K.

All air carriers are independent contractors and are not owned, managed, controlled or operated by A&K. Your airline ticket constitutes a contract between yourself and the airlines (and not A&K), even if purchased through A&K. A&K is not liable for, and does not assume responsibility or accept claims with regard to, seat assignments, name changes, schedule changes, flight changes and/or cancellations. Should you change or cancel your air transportation arrangements before or after your travel begins, all airline change and cancellation fees will apply.

BAGGAGE

A&K provides portage of up to two (2) pieces of baggage per person. Please note should your journey include internal/domestic or charter flights, your luggage allowance may be less than two (2) pieces of baggage and weight/size restrictions and additional costs may apply.

Details will be provided in your Pre-Travel Documentation. Baggage and personal effects are at the owner's risk throughout the travel program, and A&K assumes no liability for lost or damaged baggage. PRICES AND ARRANGEMENTS

Quoted program prices are per person, double occupancy except where indicated. A&K is under no obligation to give a breakdown in costs of any journey. Pre- and Post-Tour Extensions are only available to guests booked on related group journeys. CHILD POLICY
