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

DAY 1: Arrive Nairobi, Kenya

Drive to Amboseli National Park, known for its thriving big game population and views of towering Mount Kilimanjaro. After lunch, explore the acacia woodland, freshwater swamps, scrub brush and open plains in search of wildlife. Part of the park is composed of a dried-up lakebed, where mirages rise from the shimmering heat. *Tawi Lodge* | *Meals: B L D*

DAY 3: Amboseli National Park | *Mountainside Sightings* Set out at dawn, watching for elephants, zebras and wildebeest

along the saltpan trails. Spend midday at leisure before taking an afternoon game drive. *Tawi Lodge* | *Meals: B L D*

DAY 4: Tarangire National Park | Abundant Game Viewing

Drive to Tarangire National Park in Tanzania. See elephants shaded by baobab trees, prolific birdlife and monkeys, who playfully scamper through the groundwater forest. *Sanctuary Swala* | *Meals: B L D*

DAY 5: Tarangire National Park | Into the Wild

Spend a full day exploring Tarangire National Park, backdropped by the spectacular, rust-hued Great Rift Valley. At Tarangire, find a stunning concentration of animals — herds of elephants, impalas and zebras — all of which traverse the sprawling plains. *Sanctuary Swala* | *Meals: B L D*

DAY 6: Ngorongoro Crater | Wildlife-Rich Haven

Learn how Africans live today, exploring in and around the village

of Mto wa Mbu, as you ride by *tuk-tuk*, a major form of transport here. See rice fields and a banana plantation, and try banana beer at a local bar. In the village, enjoy a walk through the local market to see the colorful produce on display. After lunch in the village, head toward Ngorongoro Crater. Arrive at Gibb's Farm, on the forested slopes of Ngorongoro Conservation Area. Established as a coffee farm in the 1920s and refurbished as a luxurious boutique inn, Gibb's Farm offers you the charm of another era. *Gibb's Farm* | *Meals: B L D*

DAY 7: Ngorongoro Crater | Maasai Village Visit

Set out on a full-day game drive in Ngorongoro Crater to explore the panoramic, short-grass prairies along the crater floor — home to rare black rhinos as well as lions, hyenas and gazelles. See colorfully garbed Maasai herdsmen, who call the stunning landscape home. This afternoon, visit a Maasai village and meet with an elder to learn about local culture and traditions. *Gibb's Farm | Meals: B L D*

DAYS 8-10: Serengeti National Park | Historic Excavations

Drive to Serengeti National Park, pausing en route for a privately guided visit at archaeologically rich Olduvai Gorge. The vast Tanzanian landscape hosts one of earth's last remaining wildlife spectacles: the annual Great Migration, when a staggering number of herbivores trek across the Serengeti plains in search

of water and fresh grass — hungry predators following in their wake. Over the next two days, your adventure may reveal giraffes, wildebeest, elephants and much more on morning and afternoon game drives through the boundless Serengeti, home of one of the largest wildlife populations in the world. Keep your camera at the ready for a pack of cheetahs, herd of buffalo or pride of lions. Here, too, reside over 500 species of birds, among them eagles, who glide effortlessly above the sun-soaked landscape. Four Seasons Safari Lodge Serengeti | Meals: B L D

DAY 11: Masai Mara Game Reserve | Kenya's Crown Jewel Fly to the Masai Mara Game Reserve. This afternoon, set out on a game drive that introduces you to the famed reserve, where you find the greatest concentration of species in all of Kenya. Sanctuary Olonana | Meals: B L D

DAYS 12-13: Masai Mara Game Reserve | The "Big Five"

DAY 1: Arrive Nairobi, Kenya

DAY 3: Amboseli National Park | Mountainside Sightings

DAY 4: Lake Manyara National Park | Great Rift Valley

Travel by road to Arusha, crossing the border of Tanzania. Afterward, browse the colorful stalls of the village market, as merchants display locally grown rice and bananas in a variety of colors. DAY 5: Ngorongoro Crater | Wildlife in the Round

Enjoy a game drive through Lake Manyara National Park and discover diverse wildlife and many bird species amid a tangle of rainforest-like foliage. After a farm-fresh lunch, continue to the Ngorongoro Crater, a natural wildlife haven formed from a collapsed volcano, and check in to your lodge on the crater's rim. *Ngorongoro Serena Safari Lodge* | *Meals: B L D*

DAY 6: Ngorongoro Crater | Natural Wildlife Haven

Wind your way through the landscape of Ngorongoro Crater. Its prairies are an ideal spot to see hyenas, buffalo and gazelles; the crater also boasts a large lion population. After a picnic lunch, visit a Maasai village to experience its culture firsthand. *Ngorongoro Serena Safari Lodge* | *Meals: B L D*

DAYS 7-8: Serengeti National Park | Rambling Plains

Drive to the vast, wildlife-rich Serengeti National Park, stopping en route for a privately guided tour of Olduvai Gorge. The Serengeti is home to lions, leopards, hyenas, cheetahs, giraffes and topi. The Serengeti is also the setting of the Great Migration, and your morning and afternoon game drives include the opportunity to witness the astounding herds of migrating zebras and wildebeest up close. *Serengeti Serena Safari Lodge* | *Meals: B L D*

DAY 9: Masai Mara Game Reserve | Kenya's Crown Jewel

Fly to the Masai Mara Game Reserve. This afternoon, a game drive introduces you to the famed reserve, where you find the greatest concentration of species in all of Kenya.



Watch crocodiles bask in the sun, hippos wallow in the muddy water and monkeys frolic overhead; see elephants roam the forest edge, as lanky, graceful giraffes survey the plains. *Mara Serena Safari Lodge* | *Meals: B L D*

DAY 12: Depart Nairobi

After settling into the scenic property, set out in search of big game. There is a particularly large elephant population in the park. As you explore the acacia woodland, scrub brush, freshwater swamps and open plains, watch for hippos, buffalo, hyenas and many species of birds. *Tortilis Camp | Meals: B L D*

DAY 3: Amboseli National Park | Game Drives Till Sunset

Spend the day on exciting game drives, looking for lions and cheetahs as they hide from the heat or amble out to hunt. See the warm, golden sun set over the grasslands and mighty mountain from atop prehistoric Observation Hill. *Tortilis Camp | Meals: B L D*

DAY 4: Lewa Wildlife Conservancy | Slumber Under Canvas

Fly to the Lewa Wildlife Conservancy, home of big cats, elephants and endangered black rhinos. Your tented camp is tucked into the Northern Frontier District, in a private wildlife conservancy and rhino sanctuary. Take to the bush this afternoon, watching closely for indigenous northern species, such as the beisa oryx, Somali ostrich, reticulated giraffe, Grevy's zebra and the unusual long-necked gerenuk, which stands on its hind legs to feed. Look, too, for Grant's

gazelles, dik-diks, elands and impala as they, along with majestic leopards and lions, roam the vast landscape. After dinner, sleep securely in elegantly appointed tents, enveloped by the sounds of the African night. *Lewa Safari Camp* | *Meals: BLD*

DAY 5: Lewa Wildlife Conservancy | Rare & Unique Species

Today, spend the morning and afternoon viewing game in this pristine conservancy. Whether you opt to set out in safari vehicles, on horseback or on foot, keep your eyes trained for lions, black and white rhinos, elephants, oryx, and aquatic sitatungas — swamp-dwelling antelopes. Relax on your private veranda, and indulge in gourmet meals and remote sundowners, prepared by your attentive staff. *Lewa Safari Camp* | *Meals: B L D*

DAY 6: Nanyuki | Fairmont Mount Kenya Safari Club

Drive to Nanyuki, stopping en route at Nanyuki Spinners and Weavers, a project aimed at empowering women to enjoy sustainable livelihoods. Arrive at Fairmont Mount Kenya Safari Club. Check in and spend an afternoon at leisure, perhaps enjoying a swim in the heated pool or choosing one of the many optional activities available, such as horseback riding on the slopes of Mount Kenya, golfing or trout fishing. DAYS 8-9: Masai Mara Game Reserve | Stunning Safari Days

Over the next two days, intersect the boundless plains by safari vehicle. The Masai Mara, an essential part of the greater Serengeti ecosystem, hosts the annual wildebeest migration. Never short on thrills, this quintessential landscape of rolling grasslands and acacia savannas hosts the largest lion population, as well as zebras, spotted hyenas, black-backed jackals, hippos, giraffes, elands and wildebeest. 
