

ESSENTIAL INFORMATION FOR WINGS OVER ISRAEL, JORDAN & EGYPT

PASSPORT AND VISA INFORMATION

Your passport needs to be valid for **at least six (6) months** after your journey ends, and should have a minimum of two (2) blank visa pages for entry and exit stamps.

Israel

Holders of U.S. and Canadian passports are not required to obtain a tourist visa for entry into Israel for stays of up to 90 days. You will be issued entry and exit cards for Israel upon arrival at Ben Gurion Airport (TLV) in Tel Aviv. It is recommended that you bring a large paperclip or binder clip to secure these cards to your passport during the course of your journey.

Jordan

A tourist visa is required for U.S. and Canadian passport holders for entry into Jordan. A&K will assist with obtaining visas upon arrival in Aqaba free of charge.

In order to ensure that A&K can properly secure your visa on arrival, please forward a clear, photo quality, copy of your passport to A&K no later than 60 days prior to your departure.

Egypt

A tourist visa is required for U.S. and Canadian passport holders for entry into Egypt. There are currently three options available as outlined below. A&K recommends an electronic visa (eVisa).

Electronic Visa (eVisa): To apply for an eVisa, visit visa2egypt.gov.eg/eVisa/Home. The current fee for a single-entry visa is USD \$25 (subject to change without notice) and requires a minimum of seven (7) days for processing. Read and follow all instructions carefully to ensure a smooth arrival in Egypt. If the visa application asks you to provide an email address for your host tour operator in Egypt, please use akegypt@abercrombiekent.com.eg. You may also be required to upload documents (e.g. passport photo or copy of your passport information page) to complete the eVisa process. Please be aware that eVisas are valid for 90 days after issuance. Therefore do not apply for your eVisa too far in advance. If you experience technical problems with the eVisa website, try again a few hours later or the following day.

Visa on Arrival: A tourist visa can be obtained on arrival at Cairo International Airport (CAI). The current fee for a single-entry visa is USD \$25 (subject to change without notice) and must be paid in cash in U.S. dollars. *Please be aware that long lines are common.*

Visa Stamp: A visa stamp in your passport can be obtained either by applying directly to an Egyptian consulate or through a visa processing service. While there are additional costs involved in using a visa service, this option is available for guests who prefer assistance in the visa process. Please note that Egyptian consulates will often not accept visa applications submitted more than 30 days prior to your arrival in Egypt, so do not apply for your visa too early.

Citizens of other countries should contact the appropriate consular office for entry requirements pertaining to their journey.

COVID-19 COUNTRY ENTRY REQUIREMENTS & TRAVEL ADVISORIES

A&K requires proof of COVID-19 vaccination for travel on this journey.

The following are the current COVID-19 screening requirements for entry into **Israel, Egypt** and **Jordan** for U.S. and Canadian residents. Visit the U.S. Department of State at travel.state.gov or the Government of Canada at travel.gc.ca/travelling/advisories for up-to-date information and travel advisories. All requirements are subject to change.

Israel

- Travellers are required to have proof of travel insurance outlining medical coverage valid for their time in Israel. Airlines may check for proof of insurance before boarding.

Jordan

- All travellers must complete an online pre-arrival registration form. To access this form please visit www.gateway2jordan.gov.jo within 10 days of your departure date. After submitting your registration, you will receive a unique QR code which can be presented upon arrival and/or used to upload any required documentation.
- All travellers must complete a Health Declaration and Locator Form, which will be provided by each individual airline at time of check in to be submitted prior to boarding.
- All travellers must show proof of travel insurance that includes coverage for medical expenses.

Egypt

Egypt currently has no COVID-19 vaccination or testing requirements for U.S. and Canadian residents.

VACCINATIONS

A yellow fever vaccination is only required to enter **Egypt** and **Jordan** if you are arriving from, or have transited through, a yellow fever-endemic area in South America or Africa. The CDC and WHO each provide a current list of all affected countries. If vaccination for yellow fever is necessary, you must carry an International Certificate of Vaccination provided by your physician; you may be denied entry without it. If your physician advises against receiving the vaccination because of your personal medical history, he or she can provide you with the necessary documentation for the country/countries you are visiting. Yellow Fever vaccination is not required vaccinations to enter **Israel**.

LOCAL HEALTH & SAFETY PROTOCOLS

We encourage you to bring your own masks; a supply will be on hand where needed. Note all protocols are subject to change in accordance with relevant guidelines, local regulations and conditions.

There are currently no mask regulations in public places in **Israel** or **Egypt**.

In accordance with local regulations in **Jordan**, face masks must be worn during any indoor public activities when physical distancing of at least 6 feet (2 meters) cannot be maintained.

A visit to the ancient site of Petra in Jordan is an active excursion involving long walks over uneven terrain, steep climbs and exposure to high temperatures. A robust level of fitness is necessary. A visit to Petra may be challenging for travellers with mobility issues.

CASH & CREDIT CARDS

In both **Jordan** and **Israel**: Cash transactions should be in local currency. Major credit cards are widely accepted for goods and services. Access to ATM machines is widespread in cities and towns, but may be limited in rural areas.

Egypt: Cash transactions can be made in either U.S. dollars or local currency. Major credit cards are widely accepted for goods and services. Access to ATM machines is widespread in cities and towns, but may be limited in rural areas.

OF SPECIAL NOTE:

Early Wake-Up Calls

In order to maximize sightseeing opportunities and avoid the extreme heat of the mid-day hours, most Egypt journeys include several days with very early wake-up calls.

Photography

Please be aware that, due to security restrictions, drones and/or drone cameras are not permitted in Egypt.

Food & Drink in Israel

Most restaurants in Israel (including those located within hotels) observe kosher dietary laws which forbid the mixing of meat and dairy products in the same meal/restaurant. Some of these restaurants are also closed on Friday evenings and all day Saturday in observance of Shabbat. As a result, these factors will limit available menu and dining choices during your time in Israel.

PACKING LIST & BAGGAGE RESTRICTIONS

On charter air flights during this journey, each passenger is limited to approximately 70 pounds (32 kilograms) of checked baggage. For carry-on baggage, passengers are allowed one piece of baggage with a maximum weight of approximately 10 pounds (4.5 kilograms.) Dimensions of your carry-on bag must not exceed 7 inches (18 centimeters) x 15 inches (38 centimeters) x 21 inches (53 centimeters). Carry-on bags for your group will be stowed with the checked luggage and will not be accessible during flights.

Please use the provided A&K luggage tags, even if your bags already have ID tags. This makes it easier for A&K staff to collect and manage your luggage for you.

Safe Travel Essentials

Be sure to bring personal protective equipment (PPE), including face masks, travel-sized hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol, facial tissues and disinfecting wipes or spray.

Clothing

Choose versatile, casual clothing that can be layered if the weather (or level of air-conditioning) requires. Smart casual attire is appropriate for evenings and aboard your Nile Cruise vessel. Formal clothing is not necessary.

Temples, mosques and other religious sites require conservative dress. Both sexes should cover their arms, legs and shoulders (women should pack a scarf for this purpose.) Wear or carry a pair of socks when sightseeing, since shoes must be removed when visiting certain religious sites.

- Long sleeve shirts or blouses
- Long comfortable skirts for women
- Scarf large enough to cover neck and shoulders for women
- Sweater or lightweight jacket

- Foldable umbrella to use as sun shade
- Sleepwear
- Personal garments
- Socks
- Swimwear/cover-up

Other Recommended Items

- Sunglasses
- Sun block / Insect repellent
- Simple first-aid kit
- Prescriptions and medications (in their original bottles and/or packaging)
- Extra eyeglasses/contact lenses
- Smartphone
- Charging cables for electronics
- Global travel adapter

Optional Items

- Small LED flashlight
- Foldable walking stick
- Small daypack or fanny pack

Note: We recommend that guests do not bring binoculars when travelling to Jordan. There have been reports of binoculars being confiscated upon arrival resulting in delays at the airport or border crossings.

Laundry service is available at most hotels and aboard your Nile Cruise vessel. Dry cleaning is available in larger cities. Check costs and return times before using these services.

While decisions regarding tipping rest entirely with you, we suggest the following gratuities (noted in U.S. dollars) depending on the type of journey.

Please Note: In both **Egypt** and **Jordan** it is extremely common to encounter restroom attendants in airports, bazaars, and other sites frequented by tourists. While not compulsory, it is customary to tip these individuals an amount in local currency equal to approximately .25 to .50 cents.

General Information

Currency

Visa and MasterCard are accepted on board as payment for incidentals. On board accounts can also be paid in cash in U.S. Dollars or local currency.

Language & Communications

English is the official language on board 'Sanctuary Zein Nile Chateau'. The vessel offers complimentary Wi-Fi service in the games room (connectivity may be sporadic in some locations). It is recommended that mobile-phone usage be confined to the privacy of your own cabin.

Food and Drink

Meals on board 'Sanctuary Zein Nile Chateau' are a feast for the senses. On an A&K journey, you enjoy friendly, personalized service in a spacious, well-appointed dining room. A dedicated team of internationally trained chefs prepare meals from fresh ingredients (many purchased that day at riverside towns you visit). Every meal is a three-course affair that blends local and continental cuisine. Local wine and beer is included during lunches and dinners.

Electricity

Electrical service on board the vessel is 220 volts / 50 hertz.
