

# ESSENTIAL INFORMATION GREECE & TURKEY

## PASSPORT AND VISA INFORMATION

Your passport needs to be valid for **at least six (6) months** after your journey ends, and should have a minimum of two (2) blank visa pages for entry and exit stamps.

Holders of U.S. and Canadian passports are not required to obtain a tourist visa for entry into **Greece** for stays of up to 90 days.

**A tourist visa is required for U.S. and Canadian passport holders for entry into Turkey and must be obtained prior to departure.**

**Electronic Visa (eVisa):** An e-Visa is available for U.S., U.K. and Canadian citizens arriving for the purposes of tourism or commerce. The cost is US\$20 per person to obtain a visa valid for 90 days. Travellers are able to receive their visa usually within 24 hours of completing the application process and can obtain an e-Visa up to one day prior to arrival. Log on to the Turkey Ministry of Foreign Affairs website at <http://www.evisa.gov.tr/en/>. You need a valid passport and a credit card (Visa or MasterCard). Read and follow all instructions carefully to ensure a smooth arrival into Turkey. Fill-out the on-line application form, make your payment with a credit card, and print out your e-visa. Keep the original print-out with your passport, as proof of the e-Visa will be requested by Immigration Control at all Turkish border crossings.

**Ensure you obtain entry and exit stamps from Turkish immigration authorities to avoid difficulties upon departure or with future travel to Turkey.**

Citizens of other countries should contact the appropriate consular office for entry requirements pertaining to their journey.

## COVID-19 COUNTRY ENTRY REQUIREMENTS & TRAVEL ADVISORIES

Greece and Turkey currently have no COVID-19 vaccination or testing requirements for entry for U.S. and Canadian residents. ## CASH & CREDIT CARDS

In both countries, major credit cards are widely accepted (in Greece, American Express less so). ATM access is widespread. Unattended self-service payment kiosks such as those in parking garages, train stations or gas stations only accept a Chip and PIN card or cash.

## PACKING LIST & BAGGAGE RESTRICTIONS

On flights within Greece, each passenger is limited to 1 piece of checked luggage with a maximum weight of approximately 50 pounds (23 kilograms). Any additional or overweight pieces will be charged on check-in. Individual suitcases weighing more than 70 pounds (32 kilos) will not be accepted for carriage. For carry-on baggage, each passenger is limited to 1 piece of luggage with a maximum weight of approximately 18 pounds (8 kilograms). Dimensions of your carry-on bag should not exceed 21 inches (53 centimeters) x 16 inches (41 centimeters) x 9 inches (23 centimeters).

On flights within Turkey, each passenger is limited to 1 piece of checked luggage with a maximum weight of approximately 44 pounds (20 kilograms) in Economy Class and 66 pounds (30 kilograms) in Business Class. Baggage exceeding 70 pounds (32 kilograms) will not be accepted on Turkish Airlines flights. For carry-on baggage in both Economy and Business Class, each passenger is limited to 1 piece of luggage with a maximum weight of approximately 17.5 pounds (8 kilograms). Dimensions of your carry-on bag should not exceed 21 inches (53 centimeters) x 15 inches (40 centimeters) x 9 inches (23 centimeters).

Please use the provided A&K luggage tags, even if your bags already have ID tags. This makes it easier for A&K staff to find and manage your luggage for you.

### Clothing

Choose versatile, casual clothing that can be layered if the weather (or level of air-conditioning) requires. Cotton and other light fabrics are comfortable choices for summertime. Spring and autumn temperatures dictate medium-weight clothing selections. Smart casual attire is appropriate for evenings. Formal clothing is not necessary.

Mosques, cathedrals, churches, and other religious sites require conservative dress. Arms and shoulders should be covered. Barebacked, low-necked dresses or tops or short skirts are not considered appropriate attire. When entering a mosque, women must cover their heads with a scarf; shoes must be removed so wear or carry a pair of socks. Authorities in Greece will not permit visitors in bathing suits to enter archaeological sites.

- Face masks and hand sanitizer
- Sun block and lip balm
- Sunglasses
- Prescriptions and medications (in their original bottles and/or packaging)
- Simple first-aid kit
- Extra eyeglasses/contact lenses
- Smartphone
- Charging cables for electronics
- Global travel adapter

Laundry service is available at most hotels and dry cleaning is available in larger cities. Check costs and return times before using these services.
