ESSENTIAL INFORMATION GEORGIA & ARMENIA: JOURNEY TO THE CAUCASUS:

PASSPORT AND VISA INFORMATION

Your passport needs to be valid for **at least six (6) months** after your journey ends, and should have a minimum of two (2) blank visa pages for entry and exit stamps for each country visited.

Holders of U.S. passports are not required to obtain a tourist visa for entry into Georgia and Armenia for stays of up to 30 days.

Holders of Canadian passports are not required to obtain a tourist visa for entry into Georgia.

Armenia

An electronic visa (eVisa) is required for Canadian passport holders for entry into Armenia and must be obtained prior to departure. To apply for an eVisa, visit https://evisa.mfa.am/. You should do so at least 3 days before your planned arrival date.

Citizens of other countries should contact the appropriate consular office for entry requirements pertaining to their journey.

COVID-19 COUNTRY ENTRY REQUIREMENTS & TRAVEL ADVISORIES

Georgia and Armenia currently have no COVID-19 vaccination or testing requirements for entry for U.S. and Canadian residents. Visit the U.S. Department of State at <u>travel.state.gov</u> or the Government of Canada at <u>travel.gc.ca/travelling/advisories</u> for up-to-date information.

LOCAL HEALTH & SAFETY PROTOCOLS

This journey includes active elements such as walking over steep, uneven terrain and visits to sites with limited accessibility for travellers with mobility issues. This journey also includes travel to high-altitude destinations and you may experience altitude sickness. (Gergeti Holy Trinity Church is located at an elevation of 7,120 feet (2,170 meters), under Mount Kazbegi.) Please consult your healthcare provider for suggestions on prevention and treatment.

CASH & CREDIT CARDS

The countries visited on this journey are still by and large cash economies. Credit cards are not widely accepted except at large hotels and restaurants catering to international visitors.

When travelling in Central Asia, it is suggested that you use U.S. dollars in excellent condition and small denominations (\$20 or less) to pay for your purchases. Banknotes with a serial date prior to 1990 will not be accepted. Exchange only a small amount of currency for small, same-day purchases such as souvenirs (many souvenirs can be purchased with U.S. dollars). ATMs exist in larger cities.

OF SPECIAL NOTE

Please pack your patience when travelling outside the major cities. Georgia and Armenia are developing nations that have experienced significant reforms in their economic and political institutions over the last two decades; however, these countries are still in the process of developing their tourist infrastructure.

Clothing

Spring and autumn dictate medium-weight clothing selections. Georgia and Armenia are conservative countries and women should avoid wearing shorts or revealing clothing. Smart casual attire is appropriate for evenings. Formal clothing is not necessary.

Cathedrals and other religious sites require conservative dress. Arms and shoulders should be covered. Ladies should bring a head scarf to wear at religious sites and some Orthodox churches require that women wear a skirt (wrap-around skirts are provided at most church entrances).
